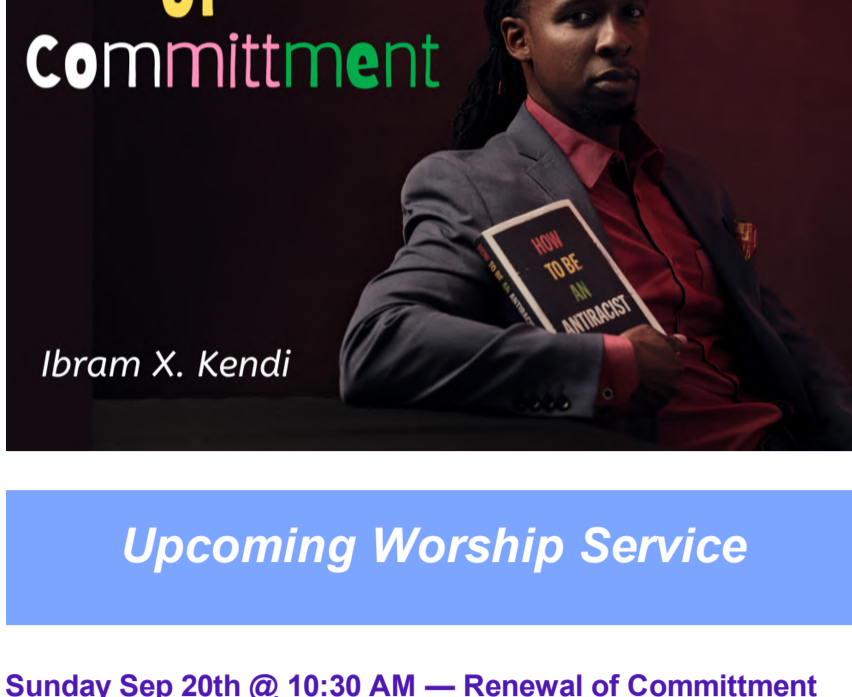

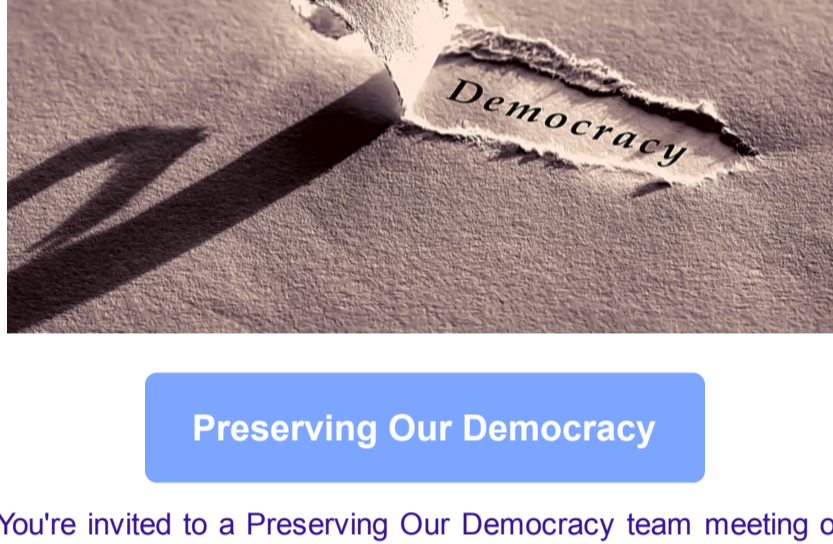

Will First Parish Declare a Climate Emergency?

The First Parish Board voted last week to support CAT's proposed Climate Emergency Declaration that will be voted on at the Annual Meeting on October 18th. If passed by the congregation First Parish will join thousands of religious organizations around the world who are committing themselves to take bold new actions to address climate change realities.

An all Congregation Meeting will be held following worship this Sunday, September 20th, to discuss the [Declaration](#) and explore what it might mean. The current issue of the UU World contains a transcript of Naomi Klein's Ware Lecture at this year's General Assembly. Reading this would be good preparation for our discussion of the proposed Climate Emergency Declaration.

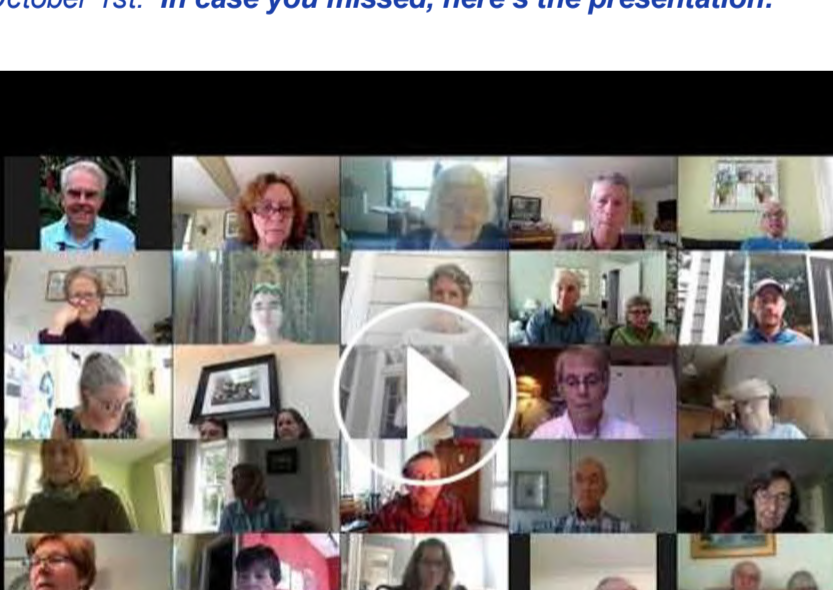

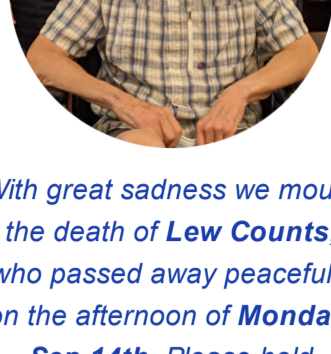
On September 27th, our congregation will gather again to hear the recommendations of the Board and also address the concerns and questions raised during the week.

In order to have fully engaged dialogue about the possibilities, it would be most effective to have other detailed and well-considered proposals to compare to the Hosmer House proposals. Any committee or task force in the church is encouraged to create a proposal for the congregation to consider as we decide whether to support or decline this current offer to buy our land.

Among Our Own



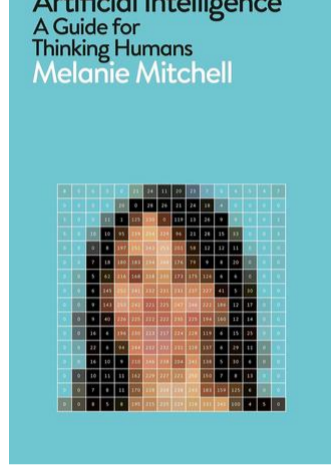

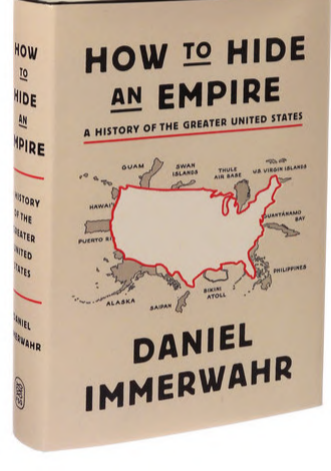

Though we cannot offer literal food during the pandemic, we are very pleased to be offering a zoom enabled presentation and discussion

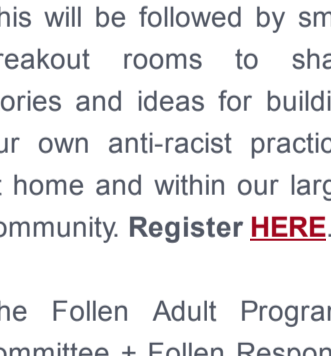
Building Anit-Racist Families and Communities.

"COVID 19: Where we are now"

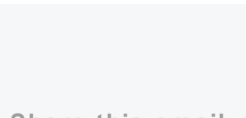
Dr. Ann Kiessling – From the Bedford Research Foundation Free Zoom presentation on **Sun, Sep 20th at 4:00 PM**.

Dr. Ann Kiessling is a reproductive biologist who has made significant contributions in research on viruses and parthenogenic stem cells. She was one of the first AIDS researchers and remains one of the most important research biologists in the country. Dr. Kiessling is especially known for her discovery of "reverse transcriptase" in normal human cells.

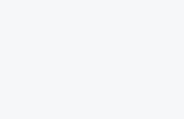
