UPCOMING Worship: Sunday, Feb 14th



The Clean Heat Alliance (GWAC, Sustainable Middlesex, Mothers Out Front and LPS Green Teams) is holding its first event on this Warrant Article on Feb 9. We invite Town meeting members, builders, realtors, architects and residents to learn more about current building methods, impact on home valuation and **Article 29**.

Article 29 represents a modest but important step in the transition away from fossil fuels by limiting their use in new buildings and major renovation projects. About one-third of Lexington's greenhouse gas emissions come from fossil fuel combustion for space and water heating in its buildings. By requiring a transition to clean, electric heating, Article 29 is a practical and cost-effective first step toward achieving the goal of net-zero emissions by 2035, a pledge in the Climate Emergency declaration passed nearly unanimously by the 2020 Special Town Meeting.
