**"Remembering"**



One hundred years after the end of World War I, we will look back and honor, reflect, and ask some hard questions. We will toll the bells at 11:00 and read the names of the First Parish members who served in the war. With the longing for peace still in our hearts, what is our role as people of faith? Join Rev. Anne Mason at this sacred service.

This Sunday, all of the music for worship will support the theme of "Peace." The sanctuary choir

will sing Gwyneth Walker's serene "Peace I Ask of Thee, O River" (from *The Millennium Suite*) and Paul Winter's ethereal and passionate "Agnus Dei" (from *Missa Gaia: A Mass for the Earth*). Austin Burns will sing Jacques Brel's powerful "Marieke" (*Jacques Brel Is Alive and Well and Living in Paris*). For the centering music, Rip Jackson will play Claude Debussy's hauntingly beautiful piano piece "Rêverie." And for the postlude, Rip will play John Stanley's energetic organ work "Voluntary in G Major."

There will be Sunday school classes for grades Pre-K through eight. The nursery will be open for infants and toddlers.



We have 93 items -- small and big -- up for bid! The auction is on **Saturday, November 17th** in the Parish Hall: doors open for refreshments at 6 PM;




**Congregational Photo**




during social hour **most Sundays in November**. The 20-inch wreaths are

**Voices on the Green: "Journeys to Justice"**




The next Voices on the Green will take place on **Friday, November 30th from 7 to 9 p.m.** (doors open at 6:30 for refreshment and conversation) Tickets are available now! You can get them by clicking [here](#), at the church office, after Sunday services on November 11th and 18th, and at the door. They are \$20 for sponsors, \$10 general admission, and \$5 for students and children. There will be one intermission.

The program will feature First Parish congregants sharing personal stories reflecting on how social justice experiences have inspired them and helped them learn and grow: Marianne Boswell, Beatrix Klebe, Larry Prusak, Stephen Shick, Ben Soule, Debbie Weiner, and Shana Yansen. It will include two nationally prominent leaders: Adam Foss, who was an Assistant District Attorney in Boston and now advocates for criminal justice reform focused on the impact of prosecutors; and the Rev. Tyrone Edwards of New Orleans, a Baptist preacher and community activist, who initiated, organized, and continues to lead groups in New Orleans to rebuild the structures and the communal life following Hurricane Katrina, and travels and speaks around the country "undoing racism."

Music will be provided by David Buckles and Matt Meyer, performers and educators, who will present original music and arrangements of popular songs with a focus on building a better world. Marlon Carey, poet, performer, and parent, will return to lead the children's program that occurs alongside the main event.

This is an evening not to be missed, exploring what it means to be committed to doing what each of us can to build a world where justice prevails for all people.
