### "The Risk to Grow"



We may be ready to say 'good-bye' to this past year – but are we ready to say 'hello' to the next? In every possibility there is the chance to open ourselves to something new – but this may require us to take some chances, to let go of old assumptions, and prepare to grow. The sanctuary choir will sing Johannes Brahms passionate "How Lovely is Thy Dwelling Place" (from *Ein Deutsches Requiem*) and Joseph Martin's joyful "Great, Great Morning" (a gospel mashup of "My Lord, What a Morning" and "Great Day"). For the centering music and postlude, Rip Jackson will play Mozart's lyrical "Andante" (from the *Piano Sonata in Bb Major, K. 333*) and Bach's powerful organ work "Praeludium" (from the *Praeludium et Fuga in c minor, BWV 549*).

There will be Sunday school classes for grades Pre-K through eight. The nursery will be open for infants and toddlers.

January 6<sup>th</sup> after worship in the parlor.



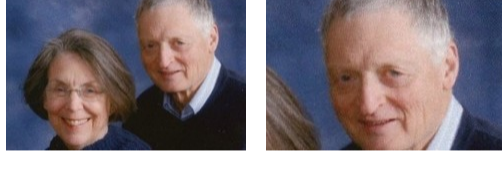
### Sunday January 13 – Noon Book Discussion

## Adult Program Offering



"Since What We Choose" — A Course on Ethics

Offered by Rev. Anne Mason

Thursdays, January 17, 24, 31, and February 7

Before we need to make a choice in the midst of crisis, wouldn't it be better to take time to explore what our ethical positions are, how we arrived at them, and what decisions we make because of them? Unitarian Universalism is grounded in the understanding that our actions speak louder than our words or beliefs. Faithful living for us includes discerning the course of action that best reflects our beliefs and values and then acting or choosing accordingly. To do this we engage in ethical reflection so that we can live in a way that truly reflects our values.

In this four-week course, Rev. Anne will offer an opportunity to examine ethical concepts, work through ethical dilemmas as presented in exercises, identify areas for further questions and exploration, and perhaps more fully embrace ethical positions we reach through careful discernment. This curriculum is taken from the ten-week UUA Tapestry of Faith program, the rest of which we could offer at another time.

These weavings can be confusing, tragic, funny, mind-blowing, even sometimes constructive. Our story-tellers this evening, the second in this year's series of VOG programs, will share stories from personal, professional, and communal experiences that reveal how complicated our journeys through life can be.



Story-tellers will be Suzanne Adams, Erik Butler, Jim Shaw, Anne Mason, Susan Cohn-Child, Len Morse-Fortier, and Brian Herrick. Elizabeth Walsh will lead music exploring secrets and lies, and Marlon Carey will explore the theme in poetry. Regie O'Hare Gibson will host the evening.
