"Climate Justice and You"



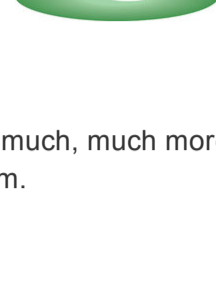
Join our Climate Action Team, Rev. Stephen Shick, and Director of Religious Education and Family Ministry Lisa Maria A. Steinberg in reflecting on our own actions in climate justice work. How do you and your family make changes in your life to care for our planet? Do you wonder what more you could do? This All Ages Worship will engage our whole community in these questions, through a homily and interaction with one another.

This Sunday, the First Parish children's choir will sing George Harrison's iconic and idealistic Beatles song "Here Comes the Sun." The sanctuary choir will sing J. Ratledge's arrangement of Jean Ritchie's poignant social justice song "Now is the Cool of the Day," with soloists Erin Lashaway, David Meharry and Toni Tasker. The choir will also sing Richard Farrant's beautiful renaissance acapella anthem "Lord, for thy Tender Mercy's Sake." Guest pianist Deborah Yardley Beers will play Béla Bartók's energetic "Vivacissimo" for the postlude. And for the centering music, she will be joined by Rip Jackson in playing Mozart's lyrical "Andante" (from Piano Sonata for Four Hands in D Major, KV 381).

This is an All Ages service. The nursery will be open for infants and toddlers

During social hour on Sunday, January 13th, more than 40 family and individual pictures were snapped for the picture directory by the Members and Friends Committee and five more were sent to us via email.

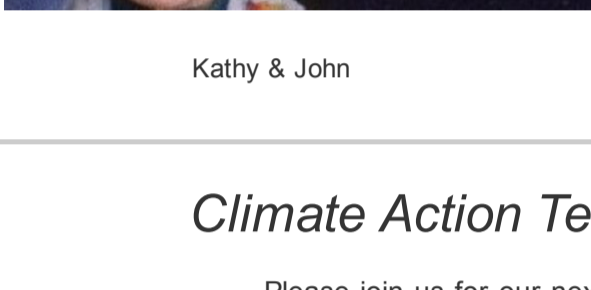

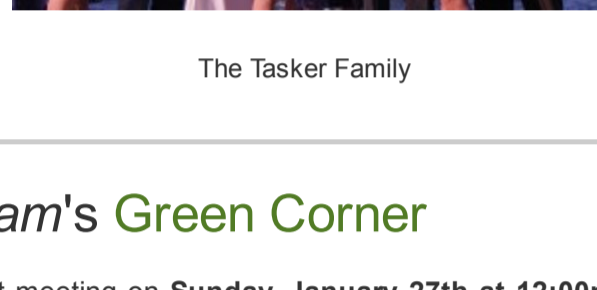

After this Sunday, the next opportunity to have photos taken at the church will be **Sunday, February 24th**. You can send them to us [via email](mailto:via_email) at any time.

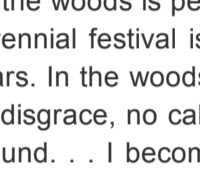

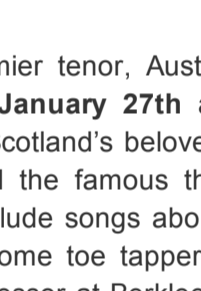

Art Exhibit Reception

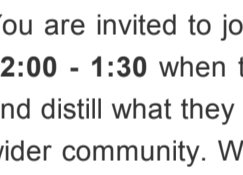
Come one and all to a reception for the newly installed art exhibit: *Possibility!*

Austin Burns in Concert

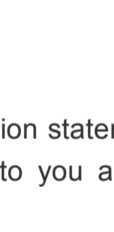

Mission Workshop

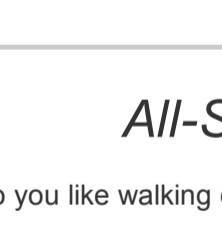

UU Urban Ministry Event

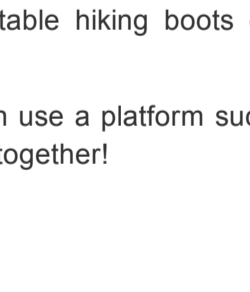

When: **the second Wednesday of each month at 9:30am**. We will allow at least two hours for each walk. Walks will be cancelled due to rain or very cold weather.

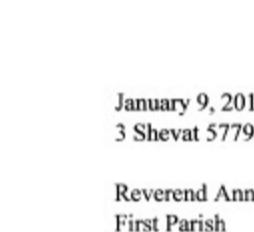
Start date: February 13, 2019 at 9:30 in Parish Hall for a brief meeting.

Dear Reverend Mason and all our dear friends at First Parish,

While the cost of having police here on such a regular basis is, of course, a burden, the awareness that it is something that we find necessary to do is far more challenging and difficult. May we soon find ourselves in a time where we may simply appreciate and support one another through life's ongoing realities, and no longer in times of darkness as these.

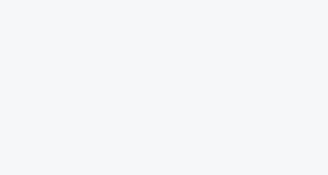

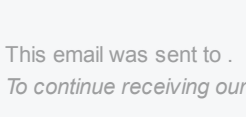
