

As we traverse the challenges of life, we may find ourselves in a place of need. How can we transform despair into determination, and anger into action? Join guest preacher Jane Smith, M.Div., this Sunday as we reflect on what hope means for us today.

Jane Smith is a recent graduate of Meadville Lombard Theological School. While in seminary, she served as a ministerial intern at the First Unitarian Society of Minneapolis. During the fall, Jane completed a chaplaincy internship at Omegon Residential Treatment Center, where she worked with teenagers struggling with mental illness and addiction.



We encourage active and committed donors to pledge at least \$3000, reflecting UUA Guidelines that suggest 3% of an adjusted* income of \$100K.


We hope you increase your current pledge 3% of your adjusted income, and we would also be immensely grateful if you SENT IN YOUR PLEDGE this week!



Hand in Hand Café


